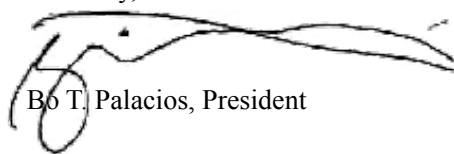
On a humble gratitude and dept of appreciation to our historic and faithful partners for their cash and in kind donations.

About the Commonwealth Cancer Association



The Commonwealth Cancer Association (CCA) is a community-based 501 (c) (3) non-profit corporation in the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands. The association provides direct support services, equipment offers, prevention, awareness and education for people with cancer, their families, and other caregivers.

The organization consists primarily of volunteers who are committed to reducing the burden of cancer in the Northern Mariana Islands. The board serves as a policy-making and working organization, with services contracted to professionals to handle daily administration and financial accountability. Seven volunteers serve on the Board of Directors, including two non-voting medical and legal advisors.

In 2021, The CCA board had a busy year and a challenging one, providing advice and guidance on services, financial and programs. However, as a result of the Corona Virus Covid 19 pandemic, the board met irregularly, every month and postponement and cancellation of events throughout the year were realized. All Board monthly meetings were opened to the public.

Board actions included:

In response to the Corona Virus Covid-19 pandemic, and out of an abundance of caution, the CCA board voted to cancel its annual signature fundraising event- The Marianas March Against Cancer and very cautious of other physical events for the rest of the 2021 calendar year.

The board approved paradigm consulting to produce the CCA five(5) years strategic plan components and deliverables.

The current situation has resulted in CCA losing its annual fundraising event. The CCA board approved to solicit funds from its faithful partners during the

past 17 years thru its Inaugural Golf Open Tournament Fundraising with the contribution realized and have facilitated extraordinary and outstanding success.

The CCA board has continued to recognize the full implementation of the hospice care program in the CNMI. And in 2021, Healthcare Specialties-Visiting Nurses Tender Hospice Care, the Marianas Health Services, and the Saipan Health Clinic Sacred Heart continued the implemented the Hospice Care Program in the CNMI successfully.

Continued the expansion of programs and services to Tinian & Rota.

With this historic partnership with the Federal government namely the Small Business Administration (SBA), the CCA Board of Directors approved the submission of an application for \$22,020 under the SBA Payroll Protection Program Forgiveness Loan and was approved.

The CCA board continued to accepted donations from generous donors, grants the amount \$484,600 for a 2 year period under American Reque Plan Act and \$20,000 from the Northern Marianas Humanities Council.



The Commonwealth Cancer Association (CCA) Administration

In 2021, the CCA continued to maintain a high level performance and of service, with the focus on office operations being service to people fighting cancer, caregivers and family members and other stakeholders.

During this difficult and challenging time, the CCA has issued hundreds of vouchers for nutritional supplements, fruits & vegetables and medical equipment and navigated clients & family members for services. We worked very closely with Dr. Brett and oncology nurses at the hospital for services, to include registration, certification and prescription for clients. CCA had experienced exemplary collaboration with our vendors...Joeten Enterprises, Micronesia Brokers, Healthcare Specialties & Marianas Medical Supply, Pharmacies, Doctors and CHCC Social Services & Nurses...Tinian (Lucky Qiang) and Rota (TJ Enterprises). Although our office at time is closed, helping our warriors isn't on hold, so neither were we. Our CCA team continues to monitor our client services, responded to inquiries, and the rest of our work – we continued to be available to our clients, but remotely working at home. Submitted SBA Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) Application that was approved for funding, the ARPA funds for services and programs Just waiting for more detail information and guidance. Continue to update client ledger, tracking, and telehealth with partners, social services workers, nurses and doctors at the hospital. .

- The Administrative staff assisted clients, family members and partners regarding CCA programs and services.
- The Administrative staff raised funds to provide programs and services. The CCA coordinated activities throughout the year specific to raising funds needed to carry out its work.
- The Administrative staff disseminated press releases to the media regarding services and programs. In order to keep the community apprised of the activities of the CCA, a regular regime of public information was provided to the media via press releases and public announcements.
- The Administrative staff compiled, wrote and published the 2020 annual report. The CCA was also well represented in live interviews on KKMP radio station via Live-Streaming and support from the Northern Marianas College IT Department.
- The Administrative staff distributed hundreds of cancer fliers and brochures and CCA brochures at a proclamation held in April, June and October 2021.

Provided Hope and Healing

Survivors/caregivers and family members support group meetings were held on a monthly basis to give people with cancer a safe and confidential place to meet others in similar circumstances, to share experiences and practical successes, and to develop new relationships in a social environment. Each meeting included an educational presentation followed by a question & answer session.

In 2021, due to the Covid 19 Pandemic, only one survivors support group held for the year and that was in October. The rest of the calendared meetings were cancelled. There were 63 survivors, caregivers and family members attended the monthly support group meeting. On average, support meetings were usually attended by 64 survivors, caregivers and family members. The

support group meetings were scheduled to be held in the Ball Room at the Hyatt Regency Saipan.

We facilitated the October 14, Survivors Support Group Meeting held at the Hyatt Regency, Ball Room at 5:30 P.M. The meeting went very well, with the participation of 64 survivors, caregivers, and family members. Introduced on-going and new members in attendance. I went over the calendar of events for October as Breast Cancer Awareness Month and encouraged everyone to engage in any activities they would like to participate. Dr. Peter Brett, Oncologist at the Oncology Center, CHCC was our guest speaker, and two nurses namely Mary Quinn and Mary Lou from the CHCC Oncology Center for his power point presentation on Palliative Care.



The following was the only special presentation in 2021. Dr. Peter Brett, Oncologist at CHCC Oncology Center, Mary Quinn and Mary Lou both nurses at the Center did a power point presentation, together with Dr. Brett on palliative care visits to our patients. They all shared their experiences and expertise on home visits for patient's care. There was a great exchange of ideas, concerns and immediate feedback related to palliative care and home visits.

Provided Direct Client Assistance

In 2021 CCA provides financial assistance of up to \$750 per client yearly for nutritional, therapeutic, and medical supplies needed to support cancer treatment. Additionally, certain types of medical were granted at on no charge or made available for rent.

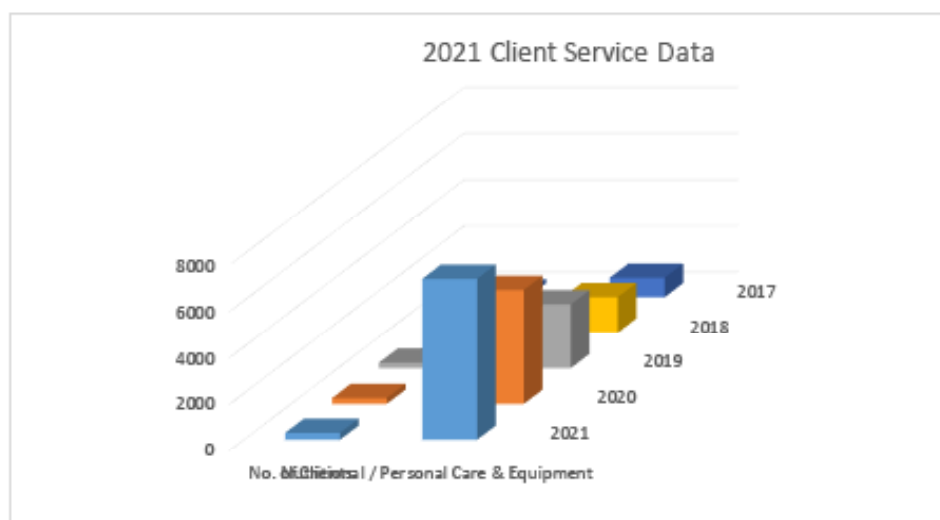

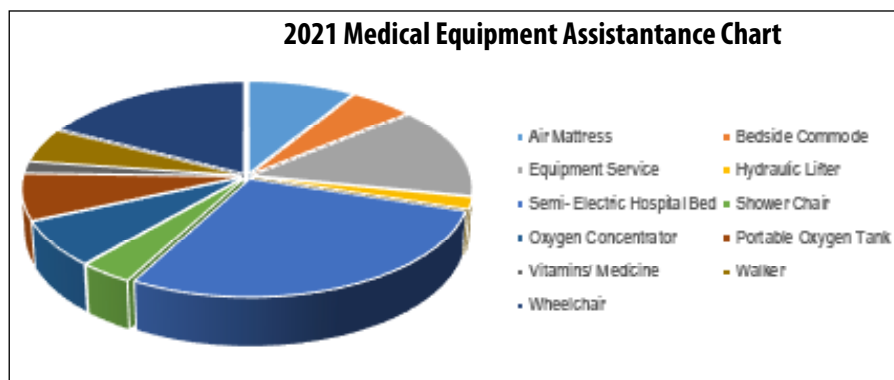

2021 Medical Equipment Assistance Chart



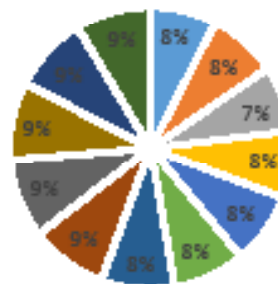

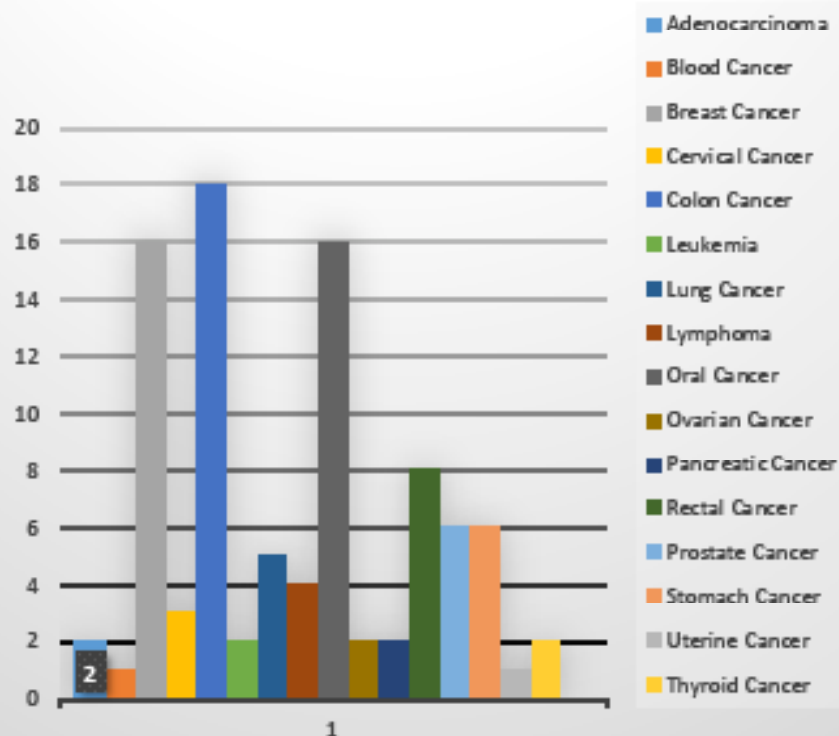

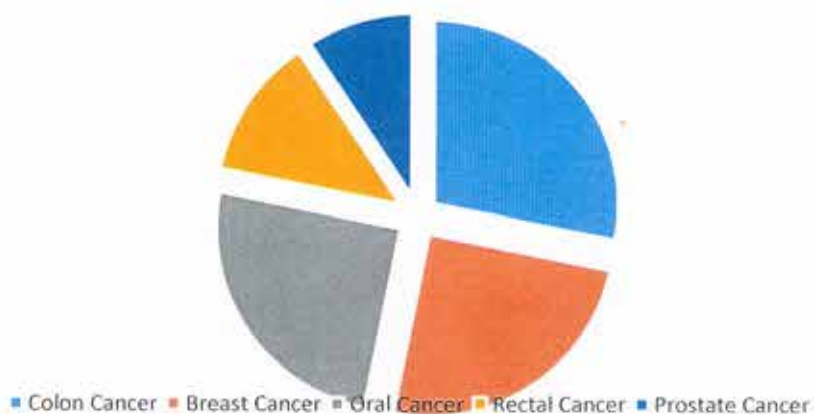
2021 Diagnosed Data Graph

Provided Patient Navigation

CCA Patient navigation in cancer care refers to individualized assistance offered to patients, families, and caregivers to help overcome health care system barriers and facilitate timely access to quality medical and psychosocial care from pre-diagnosis through all phases of the cancer experience. In 2018, CCA worked closely with family members whose loved ones have

been referred for on and off-island treatment. (medical referral office, physician, medical supply companies for equipment needed, insurance such as Medicaid, Edna, Staywell, Calvo's Insurance and the Social Security office. CCA also reached out to families at home for care and transportation needs to and from the hospital. CCA navigated 250 clients for services.
