CLIENT SERVICES

Services may include:

- Medical supplies
- Durable medical equipment

CLIENT ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

Eligibility for the Client Assistance Program (C.A.P.) is based on medical necessity as determined by the Northern Marianas Oncology Center (NMOC).

The program is limited to individuals who:

- Reside in the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands (Saipan, Tinian, and Rota); and
- Are receiving active cancer treatment or follow-up care at the Northern Marianas Oncology Center (NMOC), CHCC.

Applicants must obtain a Certification Letter from a CNMI-licensed oncologist or medical provider stating the type and stage of cancer diagnosis.
